Dear Friends,

In an editorial at the beginning of the year, I confided to you that the year 2016 would be marked by an awareness and by decisions that will lastingly affect our medium and long-term development. This first semester confirms these predictions. Today we experience in a still subtle way the first effects of the measures initiated in the past months.

Please allow me to recall the essential and to underline the necessity to apprehend already today the challenges, which are bound to appear as from tomorrow.

### **The challenge of governance**

We have evaluated particularly the strategic challenges that surround the renewal of the FIG Authorities next October.

This awareness has led us to debate our strategy on a continental level. This is a first. Our approach falls within a worldwide context in which the UEG has to fully assume its responsibilities as the most important Union, by ensuring the collegial development of gymnastics on the five continents.

In this respect, the fruitful debate and the quality of the comments exchanged at our Congress in Bratislava enlightened us.

### **The sports challenge**

We have also continued our reflections on the gymnastics that we design today for the future generations.

Tomorrow, the day after tomorrow, the gymnasts will evolve in a direction that we have traced for them today. We must make choices and therefore renunciations so that our sport continues and grows not only in terms of popularity but also on the development plan of its contents.

More than any other sport, gymnastics has an activity spectre that exceeds the strict framework of the mediated sports gesture. We have, through our Gymnastics for All programmes, a social responsibility towards the generations that use this. The media, the general public are enthralled by the show presented by our elite at European and World Championships, at the Olympic Games and we are very pleased with this. However, these same media sometimes ignore our fundamentals, the base and levels that compose our pyramid.

*EUROGYM, Golden Age*, under the denominator of Gymnastics for All are aimed mainly at a multitude of people, men and women for whom gymnastics answers a need. Sociability, well-being, education, health are the keywords of these activities and the political and governmental instances wish and request them in order to answer the expectations of those who were left aside by the socio-economic development.

On this social ground, too, we have an important role to play.

### **The economic challenge**

Our economic health stabilised with the years, thanks to the efforts of everyone involved and to the advised directions of our General Director.

Financial independence is a key condition in our existence. It is not only essential but also fragile. We do not master all aspects of the problem and depend on the hazards of a versatile

and unpredictable world economy. We have the great privilege to be able to count on two loyal partners, Eurovision and Kapital Bank, and on the benevolent support of the FIG and its President Bruno Grandi. These three pillars contribute to this stability. But it is insufficient.

In the framework of the Working Group "Strategy" we have established the necessity to better commercialise our flagship products by professionalising the entire event process, beginning with the bid of a country, a city, and ending with the running of the event. This event will be managed by the same source and by the forces and knowledges recruited among the specialists of sport, marketing and show.

This is our economic challenge. Our gymnastics is courted by the most prestigious organisations on the European continent. The demand exists. We need to nurse our offer, the attractiveness of our *products* and to favour the distribution and commercialisation.

### **The challenge of communication**

Our communication is the key word of the entire package. We have the expertise and must make it known. The economy, the market of the cycle 2017-2020 does no longer work as it did only a couple of years ago. Our gymnastics and we too must adapt to a new demand, to new habits of sport consumption. Our communication will be the link between our disciplines and our public.

Internally I observe that the information circulates better between our different technical committees and their respective public. The creation of the *Newsletters* contributes a lot to this fact; therefore, we must continue open-mindedly in this direction. The seminars and debates we organise for our members show at each new opportunity that our members enrich our Union and the innovative ideas discussed.

As our entire socio-cultural environment, gymnastics today bases its success on the emotion it provokes with the public. Our sport is telegenic par excellence. This is our force. We must therefore orient our exterior communication towards this slot, use our assets and propose a simple, understandable, dynamic gymnastics, which corresponds to all expectations of the generation *Facebook!*

In several weeks, the images of Rio de Janeiro will support the arguments explained before and will prove with these images that gymnastics and its actors are the custodians of the sport values contained in the message of the entire Olympic Movement.

Dear Friends,

I have now the opportunity to share with you some messages and experiences made during the different missions I was entrusted with in this first semester.

With regard to the events, the competitions at which I was present have shown a great commitment of the organisers and their admirable volunteers as well as a good cooperation with our *staff* from Lausanne. This cooperation is essential for the good governance of our entire Union and the success of its events. The fact that we complement competences and not disperse them is our force. With the quality of our exchanges and communication we will create, together, the

conditions for this success.

Our team in Lausanne is at your disposal and acts on multiple fronts; it is grateful for your daily cooperation regarding the good running of administrative tasks, respect of deadlines, respect of our budgets.

On a different note, the UEG has participated, for the first time, in the *SportAccord Convention*; last April, its 14<sup>th</sup> edition was held in Lausanne. This experience will serve in more than one behalf the development of our Union and its consolidation in the universe of international sport and the media, economic and political tendencies which cross it. This Convention gathers at the same venue and at the same time all decision-makers, associations, federations, organising cities and countries as well as influential economic actors of the Planet *Sport*. All phenomena guiding the sport are analysed by the high-level speakers. The official encounters, debates and informal exchanges represent a unique opportunity to make the voice of gymnastics and of its European Union heard and to feel the slightest beats of sport in its largest definition.

### **Ills and remedies**

The turbulences that trouble sport in terms of corruption, cheating, doping were of course on the lips and in the minds of the 1500 participants in the *SportAccord Convention*. Some disciplines are more affected than others by this *pollution* and we would be wrong not to be concerned, not to anticipate the risks which exist right before our eyes and which are all potential dangers for us. We are not safe.

Listening to professionals from sport, law and politics there is a truth towards which all sharp minds converge. In the end, cheating doesn't pay. This evidence may seem ridiculous to some people but it should be noted that this is unfortunately not shared by everyone. All opinions heard in Lausanne on this topic converge. Remedies exist and have no side effects.

Proof is overwhelming. It does not pay to cheat. On the other hand, the facts show with the same evidence that transparency, honesty, *fair-play* lead towards progress, to development. The highest sport institutions are engaged in a fight against obscurity, ignorance. WADA and the IOC show the direction, the rules to observe.

I invite my colleagues in the UEG to meditate on this topic and remind them that losing is sometimes part of the game. Winning underlines success, the convergence of positive elements towards a same goal. Loosing highlights a flaw in the process, which corrective actions will rapidly eliminate.

In its work treating the vision of gymnastics in the medium and long term, our Union has included these ethic notions in its governance programme. We are pleased with this and have to concretise them in our everyday life.

### **New life!**

At the end of this year, your headquarters and its staff will leave the offices at Avenue de Rhodanie to move into the building occupied successively by the FIVB (volleyball) and since 2008 by the FIG. In fact, our *mother* Federation will have the ribbon cutting at the same day to inaugurate its new headquarters. This is an important event, even historic, as we will leave the *cradle* where the founders of the UEG put us with care in 1988.

We address a thankful thought to our Founder President Pierre Chabloz, who was the soul of this move and to the Authorities of the City of Lausanne, to Lausanne Tourism who accommodated us to our entire satisfaction.

I wish you all a wonderful summer and that for some of you the Olympic dream will come true.

As expected in an Olympic year, the media interest in our sport soars. At the 4 European Championships we have already hosted in 2016, we welcomed record numbers of journalists! And the gymnastics successes of the host nations ensured great atmosphere in the venues and broad publicity for our sport. Bern and Holon raised the bar with excellent organisation, promotion, fan engagement and visibility. A trend that we need to at least maintain and even further encourage.

2016 sees the launch of a UEG video series called 'Behind the Gold: Meet Europe's Champions'. The first episode featured Israel's acrobatic men's group, the triple European Champions from Riesa 2015. The young team later on won silver at the World Championships in China, a fitting reward for the talented guys and their coach. Episode 2 is coming soon...

Progress has been made regarding our event coverage as well. Fans had the opportunity to follow all the action of all 4 of our European Championships so far and for the upcoming TeamGym Europeans we plan to broadcast all qualifications and finals, hopefully even with an international TV signal! Seeing the interest in usually non-televised events like junior competition and qualifications shows us that we need to look at alternative ways of bringing gymnastics to people's homes, not just on TV.

In the margin of the Artistic Europeans in Bern, UEG organised its second Communication Seminar. Topics were crisis communication, TV interviews, livestreaming and marketing. With speakers like Mr Denis Oswald, lawyer and IOC member, and Mr Nicolas Maingot, Communication Director ad interim at FIFA, the ideas were interesting and the debates of the highest level, with the participants keenly interacting. The presentations by the 3 National Federations -Italy, Great Britain and Ireland- also provoked food for thought. One of the main aims is to encourage cooperation and exchange of ideas between our 50 member Federations and we have definitely taken a step in the right direction.

The test event in April in Rio de Janeiro ensured Olympic qualification for a great number of European gymnasts. In only a few weeks, on August 5<sup>th</sup>, their *date with destiny* has come. Looking for to this pinnacle of sports and hoping for many European medals!

Dear friends,

Women's Artistic Gymnastics took center-stage at the Rio test event in April and again in June during the European Championships in Bern.

At Aquece Rio -the second and final Olympic qualifier- 5 European teams battled for the last 4 team tickets. And 3 were successful! Congratulations to the ladies from Germany, Belgium and France who will join Russia, Great Britain, Italy and The Netherlands at the pinnacle of sports, the Olympic Games. Of course, Europe will be represented

by 18 individuals as well, including historic participation for Ireland and Armenia!

Bern proved to be an excellent host for our 31<sup>st</sup> European Championships. Several juniors made a name for themselves, already making people talk about the next Olympic cycle! For the seniors it was the last big competition before Rio and this showed. Exciting, difficult routines were on display, gymnasts looking to get the psychological advantage over one another. The crowd loved it and showed their appreciation loudly and enthusiastically. It's a pleasure to compete under such fantastic conditions.

I'm also pleased to look back on the meeting FIG had in March with all the presidents of the continental Unions. It definitely is a step in the right direction. Regarding the updated Code of Points, we had 2 important meetings in the last two years. The first was in Krakow (POL) from 4 to 6 September 2015. At this meeting the UEG's WTC could voice its remarks and suggestions about the proposals. Following this there was a meeting in March 2016 with the Presidents of all continental unions and FIG's WTC to finalise a certain number of proposals. These exchanges are very important as it allows the involvement of the continental unions in the drafting process of the Code of Points.

As much media coverage we have already received in this first semester, I'm delighted that gymnastics will once again be one of most popular sports this summer at the Olympics. To see all the hard work pay off and give all gymnasts a much-deserved place in the spotlight rejoices me.

And all the hard work starts at a very young age. This is why UEG invests in annual training camps and coaches courses, to which we invited experts in various fields, like Donatella Sacchi, Nick Ruddock, Dieter Koch, Larisa Polosina, Sergei Fedoseev and Rodica Demetrescu. They will guide 34 gymnasts and 32 coaches, from 15 Federations, this summer in Tirrenia. Looking for to it!

Dear friends,

Wow, what a busy year it has been already! Having just returned home from the first ever European Gymnastics Championships organised in Israel, I look back on this historic event with pride. The Local Organising Committee delivered a well-organised event, with a sold-out venue each competition day and a great atmosphere. And the results showed great promise. The gold medal for the Israeli group put them -and Rhythmic Gymnastics in general- in the spotlight all over the country. A great promotion of our sport so close to the Olympic Games!

Also for the first time, UEG livestreamed the entire event, including the junior competition. With more than 20.000 people watching this, we can say there is a clear interest, which we can further develop and encourage.

The Aquece Rio test event in April saw 5 more European individuals and 2 groups qualify to the most important competition in a gymnast's life, the Olympic Games. With 9 groups out of 14 and 17 out of the 26 individual places, our continent is well represented. We wish all competitors the best of luck!

Big changes coming up with the new Code of Points, valid from 2017 to 2020, especially for the judges. After 16 years of using difficulty sheets, the judges will now have to evaluate the exercises without. Both difficulty and execution judges will be divided in 2 subgroups with different tasks, for example different panels looking for apparatus faults and technical faults. The maximum of 20 points stays the same as before. The requirements for the exercises are similar, only the numbers of the Body Difficulties and the different groups of Difficulties are new. As usual, the 2017 European Championships, in Budapest, will be the first big event under the new rules - We are looking forward to see how the new rules work.

We are also in the last straight line towards our training camp in Obertraun, Austria, where we will welcome 24 gymnasts aged 10 to 12 years old representing 12 National Federations. With experts like 2012 Olympic Champion Evgeniya Kanaeva (apparatus technique), Alexandr Savitski (ballet), Annires Marchetti and Vincent Coppeaux (physiotherapy and recreation), the success is already guaranteed!

Dear friends,

Our biannual European Championships for juniors and seniors were held from March 31<sup>st</sup> to April 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Spanish town of Valladolid. Thanks to the Spanish Gymnastics Federation for the excellent conditions for all athletes, coaches, judges and officials! 29 countries participated in this European Championships, Armenia and Slovenia for the first time. 413 gymnasts competed, 207 seniors and 206 juniors, 254 gymnasts in Trampoline, 87 in Tumbling and 72 in Double Mini-Trampoline. Also 93 synchro pairs were at the start. The Semi-finals were held successfully in Senior and Junior Individual Trampoline for

the first time.

The competition showed a high level as many seniors were preparing for the Olympic test event. The showdown between Hancharou (BLR) and Ushakov (RUS), who both performed at the highest level, was a true spectacle and celebration of Trampoline. Of course, also the non-Olympic disciplines Double Mini-Trampoline, Tumbling and Synchronised Trampoline showed the best of themselves. Russia and Great Britain played at leapfrog in Tumbling, a fierce battle that has been evolving the last decade. The host nation jumped and tumbled to an impressive medal haul, including team medals on Trampoline and DMT! The motivation and determination shown was impressive. Next Europeans will be in Baku (AZE), the hosts of an incredible World Cup event earlier this year, in 2018!

Far away from the spotlight, we are currently working hard to develop the first stage of the TrampOnline platform, a fun and attractive way to learn more about Trampoline, for coaches and judges. And the preparation for our training camp, to be held in Cascais (POR), is running smoothly too. From 17 to 23 July, 73 participants, representing 10 Federations and all three Trampoline Gymnastics disciplines, will be guided by our experts like Irina Karavaeva, Luis Nunes and Vadim Skakoun, to learn new skills and routines, work on basics, exchange the knowledge and also have fun in an international environment. Who knows, maybe one of our participants will be crowned European Champion in the coming editions?

With 6 men and 10 women our continent puts forward half of the Olympic competitors. While China dominated last year's World Championships and the recent World Cup events, we are sure Europe's representatives will aim for the sky in Rio! Good luck!

Dear friends,

The first half of 2016 has been exceptionally busy for Aerobics' athletes. With several World Cup stages, leading up to the all-important World Championships, held at the end of June in Incheon (KOR), the gymnasts were on the road a lot.

The results in Incheon, where two Age Group competitions were held before the senior World Championships, promised a bright future for Europe. 2015 European Champion finally clinched the only gold medal that still alluded her while Italy and France wrote history by winning their first ever World titles in mixed pairs and Step, respectively. Overall, 7 European countries returned home with at least one medal. Congratulations!

These World Championships also served as the only qualifier for next year's World Games, in Wroclaw (POL) in July 2017. The top 5 nations after qualification in the categories mixed pair, trio, group, Aerobic dance and Aerobic step earned a spot automatically. The 6<sup>th</sup> place is based on host nation participation and continental representation. Looking for to see these talented athletes competing in Europe again, just a few weeks before our next continental Championships, in Ancona (ITA).

In April, the Spanish Gymnastics Federation helped us host the Aerobics Dance and Aerobics Step coaches' Seminar in Madrid. 10 coaches from 9 Federations gave the best of themselves at this forum of improvement and exchange. Topics ranged from music use and interpretation over routine construction to lifts. A wide variety, greatly appreciated by all participants.

Our TC is currently preparing our summer training camp, which will welcome 82 gymnasts, aged 11 to 17, and 16 coaches to sunny Cesenatico (ITA). A week we all look for to, filled with enthusiasm and laughter, with the next generation of Aerobics' talents.

Dear friends,

The world's best acro gymnasts met in China, in Putian City, for the biannual World Age Group Competitions and World Championships in April. Europe made a great showing, coming away with 5 World titles, all won by Russia. Only the men's group gold medal went to the host nation. We saw a smooth transition into the senior ranks, most noticeably by Great Britain's men's group -the 2015 junior European Champions- who took the bronze medal just behind the Israeli triple European Champions. These World Championships also served as the only qualifier to the 2017 World Games, dubbed 'the Olympics for non-Olympic sports', to be held in Wroclaw (POL).

In the WAGC three age categories were contested. Titles for Europe went to Great Britain, Russia, Belgium and Portugal including excellent performances by the top Age Group competitors from last year's Europeans in Riesa (GER). The distance and cost to go to China did affect the number of European formations participating but we definitely left our mark. Our future shines bright!

Acro featured in the first episode of UEG's new video series 'Behind the Gold: Meet Europe's Champions'. The Israeli men's group talks about their successes and difficulties on their way to the triple gold they won in Riesa in October.

Our TC has been working hard to promote and coordinate our annual training camp. This year we'll meet in Kamchia on the Bulgarian coast in August. We are happy to welcome 70 gymnasts from 7 countries, including European bronze medallists Tim Sebastian and Michail Kraft!

Preparations for next year's Europeans in Rzeszow (POL) are in full swing. The Polish Federation has a lot of experience organising acro events in this city and venue. Close cooperation with our TC will assure the best conditions for the gymnasts and a stage for a wonderful competition.

Dear friends,

For TeamGym the main focus in 2016 is of course on the 11<sup>th</sup> European Championships, to be held from 12-15 October in the city of Maribor in Slovenia. Europe's best seniors and juniors will then be the focus of the entire TeamGym and gymnastics community. Compared to the previous event in Reykjavik (ISL) in 2014, we expect an increased number of teams in Maribor, and we have good reasons to believe that the Championships in Slovenia will also increase the popularity and boost the interest for the discipline in the countries across the north and east coast of the Adriatic Sea. A side event called "Inspire and Inform - TeamGym" will be open for federations interested in learning more about TeamGym and how to start the sport. The invitation will be sent out in the beginning of July.

In order to offer newer TeamGym federations the possibility to bring sufficient number of judges to the European Championships, an extra brevet judges' course was held in Maribor last March. 13 participants representing the Czech Republic, Germany, Italy and Slovenia learned how to efficiently judge TeamGym and we are happy to announce that all 13 passed the exam. Congratulations! In total there are now 73 TeamGym brevet judges representing 16 UEG member Federations.

This first semester, focus was also on several projects like the *ABC for floor*, which is a digital guide on the TeamGym floor programme prepared by Anders Frisk (SWE). The *ABC for floor* consists of text, pictures and a set of videos that will help learn the basics of how to create a TeamGym floor routine. We have also compiled a mini Code of Points. This is now available in French, English and German. A Russian version is also on its way. Together with a previously updated TeamGym flyer this will help to spread information about the TeamGym rules and how judging is done. Both documents are found on our discipline's page on the UEG website: <http://www.ueg.org/en/teamgym-ueg>.

Our Technical Committee is currently busy developing the rules for the next 4-year cycle. The main direction of development was defined already last year. A recent SWOT analysis has been performed and especially those items that affect the rules and the Code of Points have been highlighted for the next phase of the work. A request for feedback on the current TeamGym regulations has also been sent to all UEG members federations. A response is expected in late July. The final stage of preparation for this summer's TeamGym training camp - the 13<sup>th</sup> edition already - and coaches' course (level 1 – basic level) has begun.
