## 2.2 Competitions Format

The FIG requirements will be applied for all phases of competitions.

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No late registrations will be accepted after the Drawing of Lots (i.e. the gymnasts will not be allowed to compete), however, a NF who has registered a Team is authorized to add gymnasts to the number declared at the Definitive Registration, up to the maximum quota allowed (Ref. FIG Technical Regulations - Section 2 - Art. 6 - Registration Changes).

### MAG – Qualifying Competition

Qualifying Competition incl. Team Final, plus qualification for the Mixed Team Final, the All-Around Final, and the Apparatus Finals.

A MAG Senior Team consists of 3 - 5 gymnasts, of which up to 4 compete on each apparatus. The 3 best scores on each apparatus are added together to make the total score for the Team on that apparatus.

MAG Federations who compete with a Senior Team may bring a 6<sup>th</sup> gymnast to participate as an individual apparatus specialist. This gymnast may compete on a maximum of 3 apparatus.

### WAG – Qualifying Competition

Qualifying Competition incl. Team Final, plus qualification for the Mixed Team Final, the All-Around Final, and the Apparatus Finals

A WAG Senior Team consists of 3-5 gymnasts, of which up to 4 compete on each apparatus. The 3 best scores on each apparatus are added together to make the total score for the Team on that apparatus.

### Mixed Team Final

Qualification for the MTF will come from the MAG and WAG Qualification Competition.

A Mixed Team will comprise of one (1) Male & one (1) Female Gymnast from each Federation.

The Best 16 Mixed Teams will qualify for the Mixed Team Final.

- MAG will compete on Floor, P-Bars & H-Bar
- WAG will compete on Vault, Beam & Floor

The MAG gymnast with the highest total score across Floor, P-Bars & H-Bar PLUS the WAG gymnast with the highest total score across Vault, Beam & Floor from a Federation will form the Mixed Team for their Federation.

**Qualification is by NAME** and not by Federation (Gymnasts cannot be substituted unless they are injured).

3 reserve Mixed Teams will be designated.

### MAG & WAG – Individual All-Around Final

The 24 gymnasts with the highest ranking obtained in the qualifying competition will qualify for the Individual All-Around Final. A maximum of 2 gymnasts per National Federation are allowed.

3 reserve gymnasts will be designated.

### MAG & WAG – Apparatus Finals

The 8 highest ranked gymnasts in the qualifying competition per apparatus will qualify for the Apparatus Finals. A maximum of 2 gymnasts per National Federation are allowed.

3 reserve gymnasts for each final are designated.

#### 2.2.1 Qualifying Competition (QC)

- The starting order of the competition is made according to the drawing of lots carried out on **the 30<sup>th</sup> April 2025** by the official representatives of European Gymnastics.
- Detailed information & the procedure to be followed for the **online** submission of the start order can be found in the attached manual (**att. 13**).

- If a National Federation reduces the number of participating gymnasts or apparatus after the nominative entries, European Gymnastics/TCs have the right to modify the starting order in order to ensure the best possible running of the competition. The information about the modification of the starting order will be advised during the orientation meeting.
- The starting order for the QC will be published on the European Gymnastics website.







### 2.2.2 Mixed Team Final (MTF)

- Please refer to **Appendix 12** for all detailed information concerning this new competition format.
- NF must submit **Appendix 4** "Confirmation of Order of Apparatus" by 10:00 am on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> May at the **Sport Info Desk**.
- The starting order for the MTF competition will reflect, where possible, the ranking of the Mixed Team after the Qualification Competition.
- The final starting order will be communicated to all NF by 14:00 on the day of the competition. A sample starting order is contained in Appendix 12 for your info.







- If more than 8 gymnasts are qualified in one Apparatus Final, another drawing of lots will take place, to reflect the number of qualified gymnasts.

## **Tie Breaking Rules**

In case of a tie at any position at the end of the TF, AAF or AF, the tie breaking rules set out in FIG/TR will apply.

In case of a tie in points at any place to qualify for, or during the MTF, the tie breaking rules will follow the principles set out for a Team Competition in the FIG TR.

### **2.3 Changes of the Starting Order**

If a qualified gymnast is unable to take part in the AAF or AF competition, then they can be replaced by the next gymnast from their federation, on the condition that their result is better than that of the first reserve. This new gymnast will take the starting position of the gymnast they replace.

If for medical reasons, the best ranked AA Female (on 3 apparatus) / AA Male Gymnast (on 3 apparatus) from the QC withdraws from the MTF, the second ranked gymnast from the NF can only replace her / him, if the new Total Score is higher than that of the NF in 1<sup>st</sup> Reserve.

Withdrawals / Replacements of gymnasts for medical reasons will be accepted in accordance with the FIG/TR provided that the above-mentioned conditions are met. These forms should be submitted to

- Mr. Jean-François BLANQUINO, European Gymnastics MAG Technical Coordinator for the MAG competition

### **2.4 Touch warm-up during competition**

Warm-up times according to the FIG rules.

- QC, MTF, AAF & AF on the podium.
- In Apparatus Finals, the first 4 gymnasts will warm-up and compete followed by the remaining 4 gymnasts warm-up and compete.
- Prior to the start of the AF Competition, a timed / controlled warm-up period (one apparatus at a time under lights) is afforded to the gymnasts on the Podium. The exact timing of this podium training will be communicated in the respective WAG & MAG Training Plans. This warm-up will end 30 minutes before the start of the competition.

#### Touch Warming Up and Competition Procedure for MAG Teams during Qualification

With the potential addition of a 6<sup>th</sup> gymnast on 3 apparatus to the federation entry, please note the following procedures for the touch warming up and competition in the MAG Qualification.

When the team does not have a 6<sup>th</sup> gymnast competing on an apparatus, the usual team touch warming up and competition procedures will apply.

When the team does have the 6<sup>th</sup> gymnast competing on an apparatus, the extra 50 seconds for the touch warming up will be part of the federation warming up time. For example, on Pommel Horse, the federation will have up to a total of 250 seconds (4 minutes 10 seconds) – this is 200 seconds for the 4 team gymnasts plus 50 seconds for the 6th gymnast.

For warming up on MAG vault each gymnast is allowed up to 2 vaults maximum without deduction.

The (up to) 4 team gymnasts will always compete first at each apparatus. The 6<sup>th</sup> gymnast will compete on the apparatus after all the team gymnasts have competed.

With 2 teams on each apparatus in a subdivision, the first team (plus 6th gymnast if competing at that apparatus) will warm up and compete. Then the second team (plus 6th gymnast if competing at that apparatus) will warm up and compete.

## 2.5 Access to the competition area

Gymnasts are permitted to return to the warm-up hall during Podium Training & Competitions, without any special approval, in order to share the designated stretching area and the apparatus. Priority will nevertheless always be given to any gymnast's warming-up for the following subdivision. Therefore, permission will be required from any federation(s) warming-up on the Apparatus before the gymnasts coming from the Competition Hall may use a specific apparatus. Gymnasts will be fully responsible to return to the competition hall when required in order to perform their routine on time.

Concerning the presence of the coaches and medical team on the podium, the following provisions will apply:

- For full Teams in the QC, 2 coaches are allowed (WAG – 1 must be female)
- For Federations with Individual Gymnasts in the QC, **ONLY** 1 coach is allowed regardless of the number of Individuals (WAG – Male / Female)
- For Federations with Individual Gymnasts in the MTF, AAF and AF, 1 coach per gymnast is allowed (WAG - Male / Female).
- For all competitions, 1 team medical person per discipline and per National Federation is allowed

## 2.6 Use of electronic devices (European Gymnastics/TR)

During the duration of official European Gymnastics competitions (which is defined as starting the moment the first gymnast enters the field of play and ending the moment the last score is publicly displayed):

- Judges on the field of play are absolutely prohibited from using mobile phones and any other kind of electronic communication devices.
- Other delegation members (gymnasts, coaches, medical staff) are prohibited from using cellular phones and any other kind of electronic communication devices, except for when listening to music (with earphones and at a sound level which is not observable for surrounding persons). Other delegation members are also allowed to take photos (but no videos), without flash and must not interrupt the running of the competition.
- If these rules are violated, the persons concerned will receive a verbal warning followed by a written warning if repeated.
- If this behaviour is repeated after the written warning is issued, those persons concerned will be excluded for the rest of the competition.
- The Superior Jury is responsible to decide these disciplinary measures.
- Appeals against these decisions have to be submitted to the Jury of Appeal whose decision is final.

## 2.7 Award ceremonies

The award ceremonies will take place on the podium, immediately after the competition, or during the competition for AF, according to the schedule and will be organised as follows:

- For competition TF MAG and WAG Gold, Silver and Bronze medallists on podium (incl. coaches)
- For competition MTF Gold, Silver and Bronze medallists on podium
- For competition AAF MAG Gold, Silver and Bronze medallists on podium
- For competition AAF WAG Gold, Silver and Bronze medallists on podium
- For competition AF MAG and WAG Gold, Silver and Bronze medallists on podium

According to the FIG/TR, gymnasts have to wear their national tracksuit during award ceremonies.

According to the FIG/TR for the organisation of ceremonies, the participation in the award ceremonies is compulsory. Gymnasts that are absent for unjustified reasons will be disqualified.

## **2.8 SmartScoring Shooting Star Award**

The SmartScoring Shooting Star Award will take place on Thursday, May 29<sup>th</sup> after the WAG AAF.

## **2.9 Apparatus**

The apparatus supplier of this European Championships is Spieth Gymnastics.

Additional landing mats for all apparatus will be provided by the apparatus supplier in the warm up halls and for podium training. It is also allowed to use the SPOTTING MAT on Uneven Bars during the “Touch” warm up at all competitions, in addition to Training and Podium training.

In addition, the federations are allowed to bring small protection mats /pads / coverings only. These mats / pads / coverings (e.g. carpet mats, beam protection pad) must not be thicker than 5cm and not bigger than 1.50m x 1m. These mats / pads / coverings can be used during (podium) training and warm up, but not for the touch warm up.

A Tension Control Sensor (TCS) will be provided by Spieth and used on all tensioned apparatus at this European Championships.

## **2.10 Scoring and distribution of results**

After each competition, the results will be provided on the Internet on the following web site: [www.europeangymnastics.com](http://www.europeangymnastics.com). In addition, it will be sent to the Heads of Delegation by e-mail. At the end of the competition all delegations will be provided with a complete set of results including the judges' individual scores for all competitions.

## **2.11 Competitions numbers (Bib)**

Two (2) sets of competition numbers will be provided to the Head of Delegation by the LOC at accreditation. The numbers must be firmly attached to the competition attire throughout the entire competition.

## **2.12 New elements**

New elements should be submitted as soon as possible by e-mail to the Presidents of the Superior Jury, but no later than 24 hours before the commencement of podium training. A technical drawing and a video must be attached to the e-mail.



The WTC and MTC reserve the right to adapt, if necessary, the composition of the Judge's panels according to the situation.

All registered judges must hold the FIG judges brevet (16<sup>th</sup> cycle). To be allowed to judge the judges must have taken part in the judges' instructions, in the drawing of lots and in the briefings preceding the competitions. In case there is an insufficient number of judges from the participating National Federations, the European Gymnastics MTC/WTC will decide the process for designating the necessary number of judges.

##### 3.3.1 D-jury

- The Supervisors and D1 judges were nominated by the European Gymnastics/TC's.
- For MAG, the D2 positions were drawn by NF. The NF will allocate a judge with a minimum Category 2 and advise European Gymnastics via the Nominative Entry (at the very latest).
- The WAG D2 judges will be drawn on 29<sup>th</sup> April 2025 by the European Gymnastics/WTC's after the nominative inscription of the National Federations, according to the category of the Judges.
- D Judges are permitted to attend all Training sessions.

### 3.3.2 E Jury

- The E judges will be decided by the drawing of lots on site.
- The E-jury consists of Seven (7) E-Judges. The final E-score will be determined from the average of the three middle scores.
- All entered judges must be available until the drawing of lots for the last competition of the respective European Championship. Exceptions will be managed by the President of the European Gymnastics WTC or MTC.
- For AF, a Federation whose gymnast has qualified for an Apparatus Final (including 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> Reserve) will as a result, not have their judge included in the Judges Draw for the concerned Apparatus.
- Cat 4 judges, if present, are only allowed to judge line and time.
- As a reminder and according to the European Gymnastics / TR, the function of a judge cannot be combined with any other function.
- E-judges are only permitted to attend the Training sessions of their National Federation.

### 3.4 Judges' instruction and drawing of lots.

- According to the European Gymnastics / TR, the presence of the Judges at the Judges' instruction is mandatory. If a Judge does not arrive on time and as a result misses the Judges Instruction, she / he will be excluded from judging.
- The Judges' instruction will be held in person and in English. In the event the Judges instruction is switched to an Online instruction, Judges should ensure they bring their Tablet or Laptop to the Championships as a back-up.
- The Judges' oath will be carried out at the end of the Judges' instruction by one of the host Federation's Judges.

### 3.5 Inquiries of the score
